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## Buncombe County Schools, Healthy Blue Partner to Help Students Learn Healthy Habits

**DURHAM**, **N.C.** – During the 2023-2024 school year, more than 1,600 Buncombe County Schools (BCS) seventh graders learned how to strengthen their long-term health by increasing their physical activity and choosing more nutritious foods. For the third year, BCS students participated in MATCH Wellness, a school-based interdisciplinary program that empowers adolescents to make healthy choices. Funding from <a href="Healthy Blue®">Healthy Blue®</a>, Blue Cross and Blue Shield of North Carolina's Medicaid managed care plan, helped bring MATCH to Buncombe County and continues to support its implementation.

Students participating in this research-tested program have boosted their physical activity levels and adopted healthier eating habits, decreasing risk factors for chronic diseases. More than 75% of BCS seventh graders enrolled in PE/Health this school year engaged in an interactive component of MATCH Wellness called the "My Action Plan." This personalized interface allows each student to create personal health and fitness goals and to monitor their progress throughout the semester.

"Giving our students the tools to establish healthy habits is the foundation for their long-term health and the health of our communities," said Angela Boykin Healthy Blue Chief Executive Officer. "Investing in our youth and resources for our schools is one way we are working to make health care better for all."

MATCH is delivered through engaging classroom lessons and interactive activities and aligns with the NC Healthy Living Standards. The program's reach and impact in Buncombe County are thanks to MATCH's partnership with BCS administrators, teachers and families.

"Our Middle School teachers report that the MATCH program provides a very good curriculum for students, a platform that is easy for the students to follow and navigate, and a MATCH coordinator who is very responsive and helpful-which in turn helps our teaching," said Dr. Rob Jackson, Superintendent of Buncombe County Schools. "We are excited to work with Healthy Blue to offer our students the opportunity to build their knowledge base for making healthy choices."

Since MATCH's inception during the 2006-2007 school year, 96,598 seventh graders have participated in the program. Currently, MATCH is in 12 districts, 57 schools, and serves over 9,000 students in North Carolina.

"Buncombe County Schools raised the bar for other participating MATCH Wellness school districts this school year!" said Dr. Bryan Abernethy, Vice President of Educational Programs at MATCH Wellness.
